A five week skills programme will commence on Monday 31st October to Monday 28th November 2011.

Expressions of interest for coaching positions in the 2012 season are available from administration, you will be required to go before a Coaches Selection Panel to determine who has been successful and which age group the panel have allocated to you.

2012 State Age Championships are being played at Wyong (Championship), Gosford (Div 2), Lakeside (Div 3) and Charlestown (Div 4) Associations.

NOTE:

- late nomination forms will only be accepted in exceptional circumstances and approved by Executive.**
- Attendance at trials is compulsory even if you will not be able to take the court. Please note: **Players not trialling will only be considered where medical certificates are provided or where approval for absence has been requested in writing to the Representative Liaison Officer and approval granted by the IWSNA Executive.**
- all players are required to wear a skirt to the selections with an appropriate T-shirt. No board shorts, jeans, etc. will be allowed. It is not compulsory to wear your club skirt. Any netball skirt will suffice.

IWSNA Player Mission Statement

To represent our Association and my team to the best of my ability ensuring that the representative ideals of netball – participation, fitness, competition, teamwork and, above all, sportsmanship are always maintained.

Representative Commitments

Representative players not only make a commitment to IWSNA, but just as importantly they make a commitment to the rest of their team. Absences from training, carnivals and any representative functions (other than those absences that cannot be avoided) are unfair to the team, IWSNA and those players who were not fortunate enough to be selected in a representative team.

It is expected that all IWSNA representative players selected meet the following commitments:

- Attendance at approved representative carnivals that are held on Sundays in their entirety
- Attendance at all scheduled training sessions
- Attendance at all fundraising events as advised, including BBQ's with at least one other family member to assist
- Attendance at Netball NSW Championships/State League/Inter District Competitions in their entirety
- Attendance at representative function held on completion of the Representative season
- Attendance at any Umpiring/Fitness/Information events organised by the IWSNA as part of the Representative season

Representative Pre-Requisites

- Be a financial member of IWSNA Inc
- Have the written consent of parent/carer if under 18 years of age
- Be registered with and actively playing in the current IWSNA competition or playing for IWSNA Inc in State League or Inter-District competitions
- Pay such expenses as set down by the Association and purchase Association uniform and other items of apparel as directed by the IWSNA
- Submit a clearance to the Representative Liaison Officer from a qualified Medical Practitioner before recommencing training/playing after an injury or severe illness, and pass a required fitness test if required.
- Wear the correct IWSNA representative apparel on the court and as directed by the IWSNA at activities/engagements organised or entered by IWSNA
- Forfeit their position in the team if they miss three (3) training sessions or a carnival without prior written application for leave of absence or a suitable medical certificate which must be approved by the IWSNA Executive

The Coach selects the Team to play each game and has full control of the players on the court. The Manager has full control of the players off the court.

Player Code of Conduct

It should always be remembered that you are representing IWSNA at all times whilst playing matches, attending carnivals, and visiting other Associations. The Associations Code of Conduct applies to all representative players and we expect you to adhere to it at all times. Any instances of inappropriate behaviour will not be tolerated and could result in expulsion from the team. All occurrences of misconduct will be dealt with by the IWSNA Executive Committee.

Whilst we hope all players enjoy their representative experience, it is also important that we do so whilst respecting those around us. A copy of the IWSNA Code of Conduct can be obtained from the Representative Liaison Officer.
