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
HISTORY



Our Club was formed in July 2005 from the amalgamation of the All Hallows and St Mark's netball clubs, and 2006 was our first year of competition at IWNSA.



Although we are only 7 years young we are one of the largest junior clubs in the Inner Western Suburbs Netball Association. Our Club has enjoyed strong support from the communities at All Hallows and St Mark's to build a solid and united Club.



FDAS GRADING POLICY

When did the Club introduce grading?

The Club historically graded from 12's years but it became increasingly apparent that our girls were being out played by other teams from the other clubs that graded their 10 years players.

After much deliberation, and to also stay in touch with the other clubs, it was agreed that our Club would also commence grading from 10 years in order to give our girls a fairer competition. Grading from 10 years commenced in 2009.

Why do we grade?

"Netball" is a graded and competitive sport from the age of 10 years with representative opportunities.

The reason we grade our 10 years is to ensure that all players of all varying abilities get to play with, and against, players of similar skill level. It is important to keep in mind that our teams are playing against highly competitive and well skilled opponents, these teams have all gone through the grading process at their own club's.

Stronger players always enjoy the challenge of harder, faster competition – they do not develop to their potential if graded to a lower team just to be kept with a friend. Similarly, players who are placed in teams above their ability will also not develop to their potential when being constantly overshadowed by more talented players around them.

FDAS GRADING POLICY - continued

In this environment these players may become disheartened and lose self-esteem. All this helps to produce a fairer level of competition, a better fit within a team, more individual confidence and a more constructive learning experience.

NB: It may become apparent that players may need to be re-graded. The club re-grades players as a case by case basis. Re-grading could take place for players older than 10 years. It is certainly not meant to offend any players or parents. It is not a personal judgment of any child or family. Although winning is part of being competitive it is not the sole objective, but neither is losing each week by an uncompetitive margin.

Grading Personnel

Our grading personnel are experienced coaches within our Club who bring their knowledge and impartiality when assessing the skills of our players. From time to time the Club will invite independent graders from other clubs or associations to assist with the grading process.

Where a conflict of interest exists (for example, the grading session involving a child of the grader/s) that member shall stand down for that particular grading session.

During this time we do ask the girls what positions they enjoy playing but also consult with the coaches to nominate at least 2 positions they feel are the player's strongest positions – this is not to disadvantage but to provide opportunity. Towards the end of the season we ask the coaches for an evaluation of their players in areas such as skills, attendance at training and games, teamwork and attitude. All such reports remain confidential and are viewed only by the Grading Personnel and the Club's Executives.

In assessing the skills of a player the Grading Personnel will take into account:

- 1. Footwork
- 2. Speed & Agility
- 3. Ball handling skills
- 4. Attacking skills
- 5. Defending skills
- 6. Perception/cognition skills
- 7. Sportsmanship & Attitude

Grading may include a number of activities including various netball training drills but will always include a session of actual on-court play. Players will be formed into teams and trial in up to 2 positions that they have nominated or were nominated by their coach.

Players unable to attend the practical grading session will need to notify the Grading Personnel prior to the grading day. Placement into a team for this player may be based upon Paper Grading taking into account the Coach's evaluation report. A failure to attend grading may lead to dissatisfaction to the players. All players are strongly encouraged to attend the practical grading as paper grading may result in disappointment.

On occasions, the Grading Personnel may recommend an entire team be nominated for a competition of a higher age group to ensure they are provided with an appropriate level of competition. Such nominations will be made only after consultation with that team's Coach.

FDAS GRADING POLICY - continued

At a coach's request the Grading Committee will also assess a player (or players) for allocation to the appropriately skilled team in the future.

Aim

Parents and players are encouraged to enjoy the experience of meeting new friends and playing partners where team changes occur. The support of parents is greatly encouraged for this to occur smoothly. In most case, there is not a great deal of change to the team make-up.

We agree that all our Club members are excellent netballers and we are proud to have them as representatives of our Club. We understand that each player strives to be better and would like some recognition of that effort and achievement.

Please be proud of the team and give it your all when you are at training and playing a game. Look forward to making new friendships. For parents, please be objective and reasonable and make sure your child feels happy and excited about playing netball. Please be aware that we want your child to be successful and that it's not about being in Division 1 or Division 4, it's about being in a team sport, having fun and learning as much as you can, but also being able to be competitive at a similar skill level.

General Uniform Information:-

All items of uniform will be available to try on and order at Registration Day. The dress, boyleg shorts or scungies, jacket, sun visor, FDAS socks and FDAS rugby tops are available for purchase only through the FDAS Club – (Contact the Uniform Coordinator or visit the website <u>www.fivedockallsaints.org.au</u>)

Mini Magpie T-shirts may be provided by IWSNA and distributed by the FDAS Club. Uniforms will be distributed to all players by February 2012.

REGISTRATION

All new players joining the Club will need to provide the following:-

- Birth Certificate (photocopy)
- 2-passport sized photos
- Completed registration forms (2 forms):
 - FDAS "Player & Parent Contract" Form, & IWSNA "Junior or Senior Registration" Form
 - All forms can be downloaded from: www.fivedockallsaints.org.au
- Fees payable for 2012 (cash or cheques payable to FDAS Netball Club)

Before registering, please consider if you will be available to play for the whole season.

Registration Fees (once player is registered with F.D.A.S.) are NON-REFUNDABLE. (Please see Page 15 under "FDAS Club Specific Policies")

Players will only be refunded their fees and uniform costs if the player is not allocated to a FDAS team.

Coaching and/or netball clinics are arranged and paid for by the Club. All junior teams must have a coach. If there is no coach then no team will be registered.

Cadet teams and Open/Senior teams; it is optional to have a coach due to study, work and/or family commitments. But if there is no coach in the Cadet teams and Open/Senior teams there must be a manager that is to administer all the paper work and check/sight ID cards.

Mini Magpie Helpers: A condition of entry of your child is that the parents must offer to assist on Saturday mornings otherwise we can not register a Mini team with the Association. Currently one parent helper is required for every ten minis registered.

Late registration will only be accepted if a position is available in the appropriate age team.

COMPETITION

The Club competes in the Inner Western Suburbs Netball Association Competition.

Competition dates are set by the Association and dates are advised at the start of the year. The 2012 winter competition is to commence on **Saturday April 21st 2012** and concludes in late August 2012 finishing with the **Grand Final Day on September 1**.

"Mini Magpies" will commence Round 2 of the season.

CANCELLATION OF GAMES

Games cancelled due to inclement weather will be confirmed by the Association to the Club's Secretary around 7:30am on the day of play for morning games, and 12:00pm for afternoon games.

The Club Secretary is contacted by the Association who in turn will contact the coaches/managers.

The team coach/manager will then contact their team advising of any cancellations. Each team is encouraged to develop their own call procedure (i.e. 1 player calls the next player on the team list, who then places the call to the next player and so on).



COACHES INFORMATION

COACHES

Each team must have a coach (except Senior).

All coaches and mini magpie helpers must complete a **Child Protection Form and an FDAS Senior Registration Form** as well as comply with all legislated policies, relevant NSW Netball Association policies that the Club has adopted, as well as the FDAS Club policies.

COACH'S ROLE

- Compulsory to attain Foundation Coaching Course Certificate (our Club sponsors its coaches to complete the course). See page 16
- Modified coaches are to attend the IWSNA Modified Coaches evening.
- All Coaches are to complete the Beginning Coaching General Principles On-Line Course.
- Train the team on the day, time and venue at the coach's discretion.
- The Coach shall keep up to date with any new rules, techniques, drills, training equipment and opportunities for the development of the players in their charge.
- The Coach shall plan a training program for the team that is appropriate to the grade and capabilities of the team so no time is wasted.
- Coaches should follow a session plan/training but be aware that it may not always go according to plan but at least the coach has an idea of game play drills that can be achieved.
- In consultation with the manager, decides whether training is rescheduled or cancelled.
- Selects the player positions for each game and may consult with the manager.
- Coach and Managers must ensure each player is wearing the correct and full Club uniform before they take the court.

- Coaches, unless there are injured players that cannot compete or are away on holidays, may not take a player from another team when there is a reserve on hand in the team.
- Training during the school holidays is at the discretion of the Coach.
- Players competing in the 8 years must rotate each position throughout the entire season.
- Be responsible for the team sports bag.
- The coach is to nominate the Captain, and if applicable, Vice Captain of the team.
- Coaches are encouraged, where possible, to attire themselves in the Club's shirt.
- The Coach shall at all times represent the Club in a dignified and sportsmanlike manner.
- The Coach shall respect the players in their charge at all times.
- All Coaches will abide by the "Code of Conduct for Coaches".

MANAGERS INFORMATION

MANAGERS

Each team must have a manager.

The manager must complete a **Child Protection Form** as well as comply with all legislated policies, relevant NSW Netball Association policies that the Club has adopted, as well as the FDAS Club policies.

The Manager helps throughout the season and does the administration work.

MANAGER'S ROLE

- Prepare and distribute a team contact list to all members of the team.
- Distribute to the team messages and notices from the Executive Committee.
- Distribute reminders to the team members when they are rostered on to do certain jobs i.e. Umpire duty, Canteen Duty and BBQ Duty.
- If notified by the coach, inform the team if training is rescheduled or cancelled.
- If notified by the Executive Committee to inform the team that the competition game is cancelled (due to wet weather or forfeit).
- On game days, check the opposing teams registration cards and complete the game score sheet. Failure to do so will result in a fine not paid for by the Club.
- Ensure that the team members register themselves for Umpire Duty i.e.: sign in at the Umpire's Window.
- The manager is required to arrange the team's umpire roster.
- If you are not the official scorer, keep your own record of the teams results.
- Managers must ensure each player is wearing the full Club uniform before they take the court.
- Keep a spare stop watch for injury time (if necessary).
- Sign and return the IWSNA Score sheet to the Administration building.
- Assist the coach when required.

UMPIRES INFORMATION

UMPIRING

Inner Western Suburbs Netball Association competition has an "umpire your own" rule.

FDAS must provide an umpire for all their Clubs games

Umpires for Modified games are <u>no longer</u> required to sign the umpire's sheet at the Administration Building.

Umpires for Junior, Cadet and Senior games <u>are still required</u> to sign the umpire sheet at the Administration Building 15 minutes before each game.

<u>REMINDER TO UMPIRES</u>: All umpires must sign in 15 minutes prior to the start of the game at the Administration Block Umpires Window. Failure to supply an umpire will result in **<u>point's loss to the FDAS team that is playing plus a fine</u>**. Managers please ensure that you organise your Umpires each week.

It is compulsory for players competing in the Under12's and over competitions to umpire game. The Manager is required to arrange the team's umpire roster.

UMPIRES THEORY EXAM NOW AVAILABLE ON-LINE




Look for the picture 'Online Umpire Exam Centre' on the left of screen, or just go on to the Netball Australia website under Umpire Accreditation and look for the photo attached, clink on photo and away you go.

Anyone can sit the exam at any time there is no need to apply to Netball NSW or IWSNA. There is no limit to the number of times one can sit the exam, it can be done over and over until you get the pass mark.

Participants will be able to print a certificate if they obtain 70% or over. If a participant does not choose a response for a question, it will be marked as incorrect. If the participant passes the exam they will be provided their score and information about what question they got correct / incorrect.

IWSNA/NETBALL NSW POLICIES

Following are policy statements that have been adopted by Club directly from the Association:-

As part of your affiliation with IWSNA all Clubs/Members are expected to comply with these policies and procedures and it is an expectation that all members throughout the Association will play a vital role in supporting their development and implementation.

The Association is ever aware and continually seeking to adopt legislative Netball NSW and all Australian Netball requirements and best practice standards in its business practices.

Following are policy statements from the IWSNA By Laws regarding Club Duty Rosters and Umpiring

Clubs failing to attend on time and/or complete their rostered duties will be fined \$50.00 per occurrence. This includes Canteen duties, control duties and other duties as may be set by the Association from time to time. Failure to attend any rostered duty during the final series, including umpiring duties, shall incur a fine of \$100.00

Any senior team failing to fulfill rostered umpiring duties will be fines \$50.00 per umpire and will lose two (2) points (from the team that is playing the game).

Any junior team failing to fulfill rostered umpiring duties will be fined \$10.00 per umpire and will lose two (2) points

When a Club is required to provide umpires at any game, it is that Club's responsibility to ensure that such umpires are capable of controlling the game. Penalties apply if umpires are not provided.

All umpires are to wear either white, registered club playing uniform, tracksuit or approved shorts.

FDAS CODE OF CONDUCT



Five Dock All Saints encourages all participates – coaches, players, officials, parents and spectators – to enjoy the game of netball.

The majority of people involved in this sport, whether at Club level or Association level, are all volunteers and as such errors may occur so please be understanding and co-operative as it is not the end of the world when an error occurs.

The Club will take firm action against any unacceptable behavior. Netball is predominately played for enjoyment and poor behavior takes away that enjoyment from that are involved.

FDAS aims to improve:

- The environment of all participates
- The quality and standard of all coaches, players and umpires through courses provide by the Club or Association or online via Netball NSW and/or Netball Australia.

CODE OF CONDUCT – SPECTATORS

Remember that young people participate in sport for their enjoyment and benefit, not yours.

Applaud good performances and efforts from all individuals and teams. Congratulate all participants on their performance regardless of the outcome of the game.

Respect the decisions of the officials and teach young people to do the same.

Never ridicule or scold a young player for making a mistake. Positive comments are motivational.

Condemn the use of violence in any form, whether it is by spectators, coaches, officials, or players.

Show respect for your teams' opponents. Without them there would be no game.

Encourage players to follow the rules and respect the officials' decisions.

Do not use foul language, sledge or harass players, coaches or officials.

Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

Do no interfere with the progress and/or conduct of the game.

CODE OF CONDUCT - COACHES

Have access to self improvement opportunities; and be matched with a level of coaching appropriate to their level of competence.

Obtain appropriate qualifications and keep up to date with the latest coaching practices and the principles of growth and development of your young people.

Remember that young people participate for pleasure and winning is only part of the fun

Never ridicule or yell at a young player for making a mistake or not coming first

Be reasonable in your demands on players' time, energy and enthusiasm

Operate within the rules and spirit of your sport and teach your players to do the same

Ensure that the time players spend with you is a positive experience. All young people are deserving of equal attention and opportunities.

Avoid overplaying the talented players; the just-average need and deserve equal time

Ensure that equipment and facilities meet safety standards and are appropriate to the age and ability of all players.

Display control, respect and professionalism to all involved in sport. This includes opponents, coaches, officials, administrators, the media, parents and spectators. Encourage players to do the same.

Show concern and caution towards sick and injured players. Follow the advice of a physician when determining whether an injured player is ready to recommence training or competition.

Any physical contact with a young person should be appropriate to the situation and necessary for the player's skill development.

Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion

Treat each player as an individual. Respect the talent, development stage and goals of each player, and help each player reach their full potential.

CODE OF CONDUCT – PLAYERS

Treat coach/manager with respect and openness.

Play by the rules. **Never** argue with an official. If you disagree have your captain, coach or manager approach the official during the break or after the competition.

Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials and sledging other players, deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent are not acceptable or permitted behaviours in any sport.

Be a good sport. Applaud all good plays whether they are made by your team or the opposition.

Treat all participants in your sport as you like to be treated. Do not bully or take unfair advantage of another competitor.

Participate for your own enjoyment and benefit, not just to please parents and coaches.

Do not interfere with the progress and/or conduct of the game.

CODE OF CONDUCT - PARENTS

Show appreciation and respect for volunteer coaches, officials, and administrators. Without them your child could not participate.

Remember that children participate in sport for **their** enjoyment not yours. Encourage children to participate, do not force them.

Focus on the child's efforts and performance rather than winning or losing.

Encourage children to play according to the rules and to settle disagreements without resorting to hostility or violence.

Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a competition game.

Remember that children learn best by example

Appreciate good performances and skilful plays by all participants.

Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities.

Respect officials' decision and teach children to do likewise.

CHILD PROTECTION & INTERVENTION POLICY – Policy Statement

Netball NSW is committed to ensuring that the safety, welfare and wellbeing of children are maintained at all times during their participation in activities run by Netball NSW and its member bodies.

Netball NSW aims to promote a safe environment for all children and to assist all staff, officials, coaches, members and volunteers to recognise child abuse and neglect and follow the appropriate notification procedures when reporting alleged abuse.

The focus of the policy and guidelines is the prevention of child abuse in the sporting environment

This policy and guidelines promote the care and protection of children participating in Netball NSW and provide information and direction for employees, officials, coaches, volunteers and members of the organisation.

ANTI-HARASSMENT POLICY – Policy Statement

The Netball NSW is committed to providing a sport and work environment free of harassment.

Anyone who works for or represents Netball NSW, and everyone with whom Netball NSW deals, has the right to be treated with respect and dignity.

Netball NSW will not tolerate harassment in the organisation or anyone associated with it

Netball NSW will take all complaints confidentially and shall discreetly investigate such complaint.

Disciplinary action can be taken against a person who is found in breach of this policy.

ENVIRONMENT, HEALTH AND SAFETY – Policy Statement

Netball NSW is committed to the Environmental Health and Safety of all members of the Association, all affiliated members of the Netball NSW, and those visiting the Associations

Netball NSW will actively support and maintain high standards of Environmental Health and Safety whilst recognising our operation constraints.

We will continue in our endeavours to be national leaders in providing an environment that is safe and without risk to health.

All Netball NSW personnel, contractors, agents and affiliates are hereby given notice that no process in any of our daily operation is more important than providing an environment that is safe and healthy for all.

You are empowered and obliged to seek out a solution or report any situation that may pose a threat to the Policy.

You shall not hinder nor interfere with any person or process that has been provided in the interests of the environment, life safety or for health reasons.

Whilst compliance with the applicable Legislation & Standards are recognised as the minimum standard we will pursue the avenues of continuous improvement and risk minimisation in environmental, health and safety practices across all areas of Netball NSW operations.

We promote to all of our vested associates the importance we place on this policy.

CHILD PROTECTION, ANTI HARASSMENT POLICY, CODE OF CONDUCT

Do not interfere with the progress and/or conduct of the game unless called to do so by another official

Abide by the officials' decisions.

NETBALL NSW PREGNANCY POLICY

Netball is a contact and collision sport and is not recommended for pregnant athletes. All persons participating in Netball should seek medical and legal advice on this issue.

FIVE DOCK ALL SAINTS CLUB SPECIFIC POLICIES

Our Club has adopted all the relevant legislated policies required by the New South Wales Netball Association and the Inner Western Suburbs Netball Association, including:-

- Environment, Health, Safety Policy
- Netball NSW Pregnancy Policy

Five Dock All Saints Netball Club has adopted the following codes, including:-

- Code of Conduct for Players
- Code of Conduct for Parents
- Code of Conduct for Spectators
- Code of Conduct for Coaches
- Code of Ethics for Administrators

The Executive can exercise discretion to re-grade year on year on a case by case basis as specified in the grading policy section.

Teams are to be made up of a maximum of 9 players.

If a team has more than 9 players and another team in that same age division has a deficient number of players, the Executive Committee may exercise its absolute discretion in the final make-up of the team. The Committee's decision will be final.

The Club will only grade players competing in the 10 years competition when there is more than one team in the same age division. Any team registering in 11 years as a complete team may be "paper graded" by the Club or regraded as per grading policy.

Before registering, please consider if you will be available to play for the whole season. All registration fees once paid are **non refundable**, (except where a team cannot be formed due to insufficient players i.e.: less than 7 players, and/or provided registration has not been submitted to the Inner Western Suburbs Netball Association).

FDAS COACH'S POLICY

Note: Coaches under the age of 18 years must be supported by an adult manager or adult assistant coach. The assistant coach is to be present on game days and training sessions.

To give our coaches the technical skills to competently and safely coach our teams, where ever possible the Club will provide courses to our coaches, whether these are run by FDAS or the Association.

The role of the coach is important and it is imperative that the coach have the necessary skills and technical ability to coach and guide the team.

Mini Magpie and Modified Coaches Information Night (organized by IWSNA)

An information night is held before the winter competition season starts in the Administration building at Cintra Park. It is extremely important for all mini magpie and modified coaches to attend. There will be paper hand-outs given to the coaches.

(A) Beginning Coaching General Principal Courses – Compulsory

Beginning Coaching General Principals (Online course)

As a minimum all FDAS coaches are to complete the "*Beginning Coaching General Principles*" course provided FREE OF CHARGE from the Australian Sports Commission. It is an easy online course that can be done at any time of day in the comfort of your own home. There is no fail on this online course. Please print off your certificate once you have successfully completed the course and hand it into the FDAS Secretary.

(B)Foundation & Development Coaching Courses – Optional

- The Foundation Coaching Course (accredited) 5 hours in-course work
- The Development Coaching Course (accredited) 7 hours in-course work
- Attendance at Beginners, Intermediate, Advanced coaching courses which may be offered by the IWSNA

These courses will be made available via the Inner Western Suburbs Netball Association. All FDAS coaches will be notified when this course becomes available. The Club will meet the cost of the courses.

Foundation Coaching Course (As player's abilities and needs progress)

This course is designed to enhance the knowledge of coaches who are coaching at Club level. It is an accredited course under the Netball Australia Coaching Accreditation Scheme and provides training to the large numbers of coaches who are actively involved in netball. Completion of this course will also result in Foundation Coaching Accreditation with the National Coaching Accreditation Scheme (NCAS) as administered by the Australian Sports Commission (ASC).

Enrolment Pre-requisites

- Participants must be at least 14 years of age on completion of the Foundation Course to be eligible for accreditation.
- All Foundation Coaching Course participants must be registered members of their local State/Territory Netball Association prior to accreditation being granted to ensure adequate insurance cover. All FDAS coaches are registered.

Course Pre-requisites

The Australian Sports Commission (ASC) <u>Beginning Coaching General Principles</u> is a prerequisite for the Foundation Coaching Course. The course covers the theory component of the Foundation Coaching Course, enabling the course to be particularly focused.

Development Coaching Course (As player's abilities and needs progress)

This course is designed to enhance the knowledge of coaches who are coaching at Club, Association and Regional level. It is an accredited course under the Netball Australia Coaching Accreditation Scheme and provides training to the large numbers of coaches who are actively involved in netball. Completion of this course will also result in Development Coaching Accreditation with the National Coaching Accreditation Scheme (NCAS) as administered by the Australian Sports Commission (ASC).

Enrolment Pre-requisites

- Participants must be at least 15 years of age on completion of the Development Course to be eligible for accreditation.
- All Development Coaching Course participants must be registered members of their local State/Territory Netball Association prior to accreditation being granted to ensure adequate insurance cover. All FDAS coaches are registered.

Course Pre-requisites

Participants must have completed the following prerequisites:

- Completion of a Netball Australia Foundation Coaching Course.
- Current Section 1 Umpire Theory Examination (pass 70% or above).
- Coaches must have had at least one year/season coaching experience after completion of the Netball Australia Foundation Coaching Course.

FDAS UMPIRE'S POLICY

The Inner Western Suburbs Netball Association competition has an "umpire your own" rule. FDAS must provide an umpire for all their Club games.

All umpires must sign in 15 minutes prior to the start of the game at the Administration Block Umpires Window. Failure to supply an umpire will result in **points loss to the FDAS team that is playing plus a fine.**

It is compulsory for players competing in the 12 years and over competitions to umpire games. The Manager is required to arrange the team's umpire roster.

Umpires will be allocated games via an email by the FDAS Umpire Convener Association Junior Umpire badging will be conducted twice during the season.

Pre-requisites IWNSA Association Junior Umpire Badge "C", "B", "A"

- This will be for girls who have umpired on a regular basis and have had at least umpired a minimum of 4 games unassisted.
- Completion certificate from the online Umpires Theory exam (details of the link are on our website), please hand this certificate into the FDAS Umpire convener.
- Umpire at least one, preferably two, Association Representative Carnivals.

For senior umpires who have attained their Association Junior A Badge, you will be eligible to be assessed for the National C, B, and/or A badge. Please see the FDAS Umpire convener for more information.

Pre-requisites for National Badge C, B, and A Badge (see attached table)

- Attend the Level One Umpires Course this course is provided by the Inner Western Suburbs Netball Association. Details will be made available when they come to hand.
- Completion certificate from the online Umpires Theory exam (details of the link are on our website), please hand this certificate into the FDAS Umpire convener.

- Umpires, shall at all times, represent the Club with dignity and sportsmanlike behaviour
- Umpires are required to provide their own equipment for officiating at matches

- Umpires shall remain detached and neutral when officiating at matches
- Umpires shall remain detached from team issues and sideline issues when officiating at matches
- All Umpires will abide by the "Code of Conduct for Umpires" policy

- Umpires must attend umpires clinics conducted by the Club and/or the Association
- As a prerequisite to Association Badge Awards Umpires must attend at least one, preferably two, representative carnivals to umpire at the games

FDAS PLAYER'S POLICY

- All players are required to attire themselves for games in the complete official playing uniform of the Club
- All players are required to treat their team mates, coach, manager, officials and opponents with dignity and respect
- Any misconduct by players (i.e.: swearing, abusive behavior, umpires etc) will not be tolerated by the Club
- All players in the intermediate grades and in the last years of the junior grades are encouraged to undertake and pass the online Umpire Theory Examination.
- Players are to be aware that netball is a team sport and to treat team mates and opposition players respectfully
- All players are to abide by the "Code of Conduct for Players" policy

- To provide a friendly competition for all netballers.
- To provide a healthy basis for the enjoyment of the sport.
- To foster a sportsmanlike attitude to the sport.
- To provide an environment for parents and carers to be involved with their children.
